

## Complete with the First Conditional

We use the First Conditional to talk about future events that are likely to happen. The first conditional has the Present Simple after 'if', then the Future "Will" in the other clause:

### If + Present => / will + verb

1. If you \_\_\_\_\_ (send) this letter now, she \_\_\_\_\_ (receive) it tomorrow.
2. You \_\_\_\_\_ (pay) higher insurance if you \_\_\_\_\_ (buy) a sports car.
3. If I \_\_\_\_\_ (find) your ring, I \_\_\_\_\_ (give) it back to you.
4. Peggy \_\_\_\_\_ (go) shopping if she \_\_\_\_\_ (have) time in the afternoon.
5. Simon \_\_\_\_\_ (go) to London next week if he \_\_\_\_\_ (get) a cheap flight.
6. If her boyfriend \_\_\_\_\_ (phone / not) today, she \_\_\_\_\_ (leave) him.
7. If they \_\_\_\_\_ (study / not) harder, they \_\_\_\_\_ (pass / not) the exam.
8. If it \_\_\_\_\_ (not/ rain) tomorrow, I \_\_\_\_\_ (have) water the plants.
9. You \_\_\_\_\_ (be able/ not) to sleep if you \_\_\_\_\_ (watch) this scary film.
10. If you \_\_\_\_\_ (eat) an apple every day, you \_\_\_\_\_ (be) very healthy.
11. You \_\_\_\_\_ (pay) higher insurance if you \_\_\_\_\_ (buy) a sports car.
12. You \_\_\_\_\_ (be able) to see you better if you \_\_\_\_\_ (turn) on the lamp.
13. If we \_\_\_\_\_ (not/protect) the elephant, it \_\_\_\_\_ (become) extinct.
